# MESSAGE FROM ASPIRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

**Dear ASPIRA Supporters:** 

On Monday, May 8th, ASPIRA of New York will celebrate its 2023 annual Circle of Achievers event. Last year, thanks to the generosity of corporations and individuals, \$1.1 Million dollars was raised to support ASPIRA's programs. Thanks to returning supporters and new ones, we are on track to raise \$1 Million again this year to invest in ASPIRAntes.

Since 1961, founded by Dr. Antonia Pantoja, ASPIRA has been at the forefront of providing educational and leadership development opportunities to Latino youth. In 2022, we served 5,978 New York City youth. Nearly all of the students come from low-income households. More often than not, they attend poor performing schools in under-resourced school districts and are first-generation college entrants. 100% of students engaged in our Leadership and College Access Program earned a high school diploma; of those, 99%, entered college. In our elementary and middle school-based programs, 100% of students had passing grades to enable them to progress with their age group towards graduation.

I want to take a moment to applaud Matt Ellis for his years of commitment to ASPIRA as chair of the Circle of Achievers gala. Millions of dollars have been raised through this event during his tenure as corporate gala chair.

Sincere thanks to each of you who partner to make tonight a success. I look forward to sharing an inspiring evening with you, focused on recognizing corporate achievers who make a difference in our companies and within the Latino community, as well as, awarding college scholarships to deserving ASPIRAntes.

On behalf of the ASPIRA of New York's Board of Directors, staff and students thank you for joining us this evening to celebrate our Latino corporate achievers, who make a difference in their communities everyday, as well as, awarding deserving ASPIRAntes with college scholarships. Tonight we also recognize you for your commitment and support throughout the years. This year we are particularly proud and honored to recognize our Vice Chairperson and Advancement Committee Chair of ASPIRA of New York for her unwavering support, commitment to ASPIRA and the Latino community.

Founded by Dr. Antonia Pantoja in New York, ASPIRA (Spanish for "aspire") has been at the forefront of providing educational and leadership development opportunities to Latino youth. Over the years, ASPIRA has grown from a local organization to a national association of ASPIRA affiliates. Nationally, more than a half million Latinos have benefited from ASPIRA's youth development, college access and mentoring programs. In New York, nearly all the students we serve come from low-income households. More often than not, they attend poor performing schools in under-resourced school districts and are first-generation college entrants. In every program we run, active students showed a marked improvement in all school subjects.

The majority of students reported increased confidence levels and greater college "awareness." Moreover, our service model encouraged community empowerment through active engagement, as well as, the engendering of contributions to the wider society. Aspirantes become leaders.

On behalf of the ASPIRA of New York Board of Directors, staff, and students, we extend our deep appreciation to our Corporate Chair Scott Krohn, all our honorees, sponsors and supporters. We hope you enjoy the evening but, most importantly, we hope you leave this event inspired to make a difference, eager to help more and ready to make the future better together.

Dr. Pantoja was born in San Juan, Puerto Rico in 1922 and studied at the University of Puerto Rico. Upon graduating from the University of Puerto Rico in 1942, she worked as a schoolteacher for two years in Puerto Rico where she cultivated a profound interest in education and addressing the needs of disadvantaged children. She arrived in New York City in November 1944 where she got a job as a welder in a factory making lamps for children.





Dr. Pantoja received a scholarship from Hunter College, City University of New York, where she completed a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1952. She went on to acquire a Master of Social Work in 1954 from Columbia University and was bestowed a Ph.D. from the Union Graduate School in Yellow Springs, Ohio in 1973.

Her most profound contribution to the Puerto Rican community in the United States began in 1958 when she joined a group of young professionals in creating the Puerto Rican Forum, Inc. which paved the way for the establishment of ASPIRA in 1961. She was also instrumental in establishing the Puerto Rican Association for Community Affairs (PRACA) among other important Puerto Rican institutions. However, ASPIRA is her legacy. Originally conceived to address the high dropout rate of Puerto Rican youth in New York City during the '50s and '60s, the organization has flourished into a major national organization dedicated to empowering Latino communities through education.







University Prep Charter High School


